The Liturgy of the Word

The First Reading: 1 Corinthians 12. 12-26. (Reading is read by Members of the Junior Church)

Christ is like a single body, which has many parts; it is still one body, even though it is made up of different parts. If the foot were to say, "Because I am not a hand, I don't belong to the body," that would not keep it from being a part of the body. And if the ear were to say, "Because I am not an eye, I don't belong to the body," that would not keep it from being a part of the body. If the whole body were just an eye, how could it hear? And if it were only an ear, how could it smell? God himself has put the body together in such a way as to give greater honour to those parts that need it.

And so there is no division in the body, but all its different parts have the same concern for one another. If one part of the body suffers, all the other parts suffer with it; if one part is praised, all the other parts share its happiness.

This is the word of the Lord. All: Thanks be to God.




