During the silence the Choir, Servers and Priest will enter and move to the West (rear) of the church.

Please Stand (if you are able) and turn to face the West end (rear) of the church.

The Advent Liturgy

The Cantors, joined by Choir intone:

I look from afar, and lo, I see the power of God coming and a cloud covering the whole earth. Go ye out to meet him and say: Tell us! Tell us! Tell us art thou He that shall come to reign over thy people Israel.

The first candle for the Advent Wreath is lit. The Cantor then intones and choir only respond:

Y You O Lord, are my lamp:

With you O Lord, is the well of life:

Your word is a lantern to my feet:

V Jesus Christ is the light of the world:

R You turn our darkness into light.

R In your light shall we see light.

R And a light upon our path.

R A light no darkness can quench.

The candles of the congregation are now lit & the Cantor intones the Advent prose:

Blessed are you, Lord our God, King of the universe, King of the universe, eternal creator of day and night. Now hear the prayer of your faithful people. Wash away our transgressions, cleanse us by your refining fire, and makes us temples of your Holy Spirit. May we live in watchfulness as we wait for the coming of your Son Jesus Christ, who shall judge the world and all its works. Rouse us from the sleep of sin and make us ready to enter your kindom where songs of praise forever sound. For you are the true light whho lightens everyobe, and the new heavens and new earth join to sing your praise now and for evermore. Amen.

The Cantor, joined by the choir, intone the first two 'Great Os' of the Advent season:

O Sapientia

O Wisdom, coming forth from the mouth of the most high, reaching from one end to the other mightily, and sweetly ordering all things: Come and teach us the way of prudence.

O Adonaï

O Adonaï, and leader of the House of Israel, who appeared to Moses in the fire of the burning bush and gave him the Law on Sinai, come and redeem us with an outstretched arm.

First Hymn: 11 O Come, O Come, Emmanuel!

Please raise your candles during the Refrain (**Rejoice, rejoice! Emmanuel...**)
During the Hymn the Advent candle(s) are placed in the Wreath or Stand.

The Priest blesses the Advent Wreath using the following words:

Blessed are you, sovereign Lord, God of our ancestors: to you be praise and glory for ever. You called the patriarchs to live by the light of faith and to journey in the hope of your promised fulfilment. May we be obedient to your call and be ready and watchful to receive your Christ, a lamp to our feet and a light to our path; for you are our light and our salvation.

All: Blessed be God for ever.

Please carefully blow out your candle(s).

The Welcome

▼ In the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit.

All: Amen.

Grace, mercy and peace from God our Father and the Lord Jesus Christ be with you.

All: And also with you.

The Prayer of Preparation

All: Almighty God,

Invitation to Confession

The Liturgy of the Word

The First Reading: Isaiah 2. 1-5. (Reading is read by Anne Ross)

This is what Isaiah son of Amoz saw concerning Judah and Jerusalem: In the last days the mountain of the Lord's temple will be established as the highest of the mountains; it will be exalted above the hills, and all nations will stream to it. Many peoples will come and say, "Come, let us go up to the mountain of the Lord, to the temple of the God of Jacob. He will teach us his ways, so that we may walk in his paths." The law will go out from Zion, the word of the Lord from Jerusalem. He will judge between the nations and will settle disputes for many peoples. They will beat their swords into plowshares and their spears into pruning hooks. Nation will not take up sword against nation, nor will they train for war anymore. Come, descendants of Jacob, let us walk in the light of the Lord.

This is the word of the Lord.

All: Thanks be to God.

Please Stand as we Sing together the Psalm.

The Second Reading: Romans 13. 11-end. (Reading is read by Sue Cunningham)

And do this, understanding the present time: The hour has already come for you to wake up from your slumber, because our salvation is nearer now than when we first believed. The night is nearly over; the day is almost here. So let us put aside the deeds of darkness and put on the armor of light. Let us behave decently, as in the daytime, not in carousing and drunkenness, not in sexual immorality and debauchery, not in dissension and jealousy. Rather, clothe yourselves with the Lord Jesus Christ, and do not think about how to gratify the desires of the flesh.

This is the word of the Lord.

All: Thanks be to God.

Gradual Hymn: 3 Come, though long-expected Jesus.

The Gospel

Cantor: "Prepare the way of the Lord, make his paths straight, and all flesh shall see the salvation of God." (cf Isaiah 40.3–5)

Hear the Gospel of our Lord Jesus Christ according to Matthew 24. 36-44.

"But about that day or hour no one knows, not even the angels in heaven, nor the Son, but only the Father. As it was in the days of Noah, so it will be at the coming of the Son of Man. For in the days before the flood, people were eating and drinking, marrying and giving in marriage, up to the day Noah entered the ark; and they knew nothing about what would happen until the flood came and took them all away. That is how it will be at the coming of the Son of Man. Two men will be in the field; one will be taken and the other left. Two women will be grinding with a hand mill; one will be taken and the other left. "Therefore keep watch, because you do not know on what day your Lord will come. But understand this: If the owner of the house had known at what time of night the thief was coming, he would have kept watch and would not have let his house be broken into. So you also must be ready, because the Son of Man will come at an hour when you do not expect him.

The Nicene Creed

Send the Holy Spirit on your people and gather into one in your kingdom all who share this one bread and one cup, so that we, in the company of Mary, the Virgin Mother of God, St Thomas the Apostle and our Patron, and all the saints, may praise and glorify you for ever, through Jesus Christ our Lord; by whom, and with whom, and in whom, in the unity of the Holy Spirit, all honour and glory be yours, almighty Father, for ever and ever.




