All: Christ have mercy.

Purge us from our sin and we shall be clean; wash us and we shall be whiter than snow.

May the Father ✠ forgive you by the death of his Son and strengthen you to live in the power of the Spirit all your days.

During the singing of the Gloria, the Clarion Bells are rung.

**All: Glory to God in the highest,
and peace to his people on earth.
Lord God, heavenly King,
almighty God and Father,
we worship you, we give you thanks,
we praise you for your glory.**

The Clarion Bells are stopped. No bells are rung again until the Gloria on Easter Morning.

The Collect

Let us pray that we may love one another as Christ has loved us.

God our Father, you have invited us to share in the supper which your Son gave to his Church to proclaim his death until he comes: may he nourish us by his presence, and unite us in his love; who is alive and reigns with you, in the unity of the Holy Spirit, one God, now and for ever.

All: Amen.

The Liturgy of the Word

The First Reading: Exodus 12.1-4, 11-14. *(Reading is read by Margaret Lydamore)*

The LORD said to Moses and Aaron in the land of Egypt: This month shall mark for you the beginning of months; it shall be the first month of the year for you. Tell the whole congregation of Israel that on the tenth of this month they are to take a lamb for each family, a lamb for each household. If a household is too small for a whole lamb, it shall join its closest neighbour in obtaining one; the lamb shall be divided in proportion to the number of people who eat of it. This is how you shall eat it: your loins girded, your sandals on your feet, and your staff in your hand; and you shall eat it hurriedly. It is the Passover of the LORD. For I will pass through the land of Egypt that night, and I will strike down every firstborn in the land of Egypt, both human beings and animals; on all the gods of Egypt I will execute judgments: I am the LORD. The blood shall be a sign for you on the

houses where you live: when I see the blood, I will pass over you, and no plague shall destroy you when I strike the land of Egypt. This day shall be a day of remembrance for you. You shall celebrate it as a festival to the LORD; throughout your generations you shall observe it as a perpetual ordinance.

This is the word of the Lord.

All: Thanks be to God.

*All stay Seated and Say antiphonally verses from Psalm 116.1, 10-end. (Dilexi, quoniam)
(Left side of Nave Odd verses, Right side Even. All say the Gloria Patri)*

1. **I am well pleased : that the Lord hath heard the voice of my prayer; I believed, and therefore will I speak, but I was sore troubled : I said in my haste, All men are liars.**
10. **What reward shall I give unto the Lord : for all the benefits that he hath done unto me?**
11. **I will receive the cup of salvation : and call up on the Name of the Lord.**
12. **I will pay my vows now in the presence of all his people : right dear in the sight of the Lord is the death of his saints.**
13. **Behold, O Lord, how that I am thy servant : I am thy servant, and the son of thine handmaid; thou hast broken my bonds in sunder.**
14. **I will offer to thee the sacrifice of thanksgiving : and will call up on the Name of the Lord.**
15. **I will pay my vows unto the Lord, in the sight of all his people : in the courts of the Lord's house, even in the midst of thee, O Jerusalem. Praise the Lord.**

The Second Reading: 1 Corinthians 11.23-26. *(Reading is read by Pauline Britton)*

For I received from the Lord what I also handed on to you, that the Lord Jesus on the night when he was betrayed took a loaf of bread, and when he had given thanks, he broke it and said, "This is my body that is for you. Do this in remembrance of me." In the same way he took the cup also, after supper, saying, "This cup is the new covenant in my blood. Do this, as often as you drink it, in remembrance of me." For as often as you eat this bread and drink the cup, you proclaim the Lord's death until he comes.

This is the word of the Lord.

All: Thanks be to God.

All: Praise to you, O Christ, King of eternal glory.

Cantor: "I give you a new commandment, says the Lord: Love one another as I have loved you."

All: Praise to you, O Christ, King of eternal glory.

The Lord be with you.

All: And with thy spirit.

✠✠✠ Hear the Gospel of our Lord Jesus Christ according to John. (*John 13.1-15*)

All: Glory to you, O Lord.

Now before the festival of the Passover, Jesus knew that his hour had come to depart from this world and go to the Father. Having loved his own who were in the world, he loved them to the end. The devil had already put it into the heart of Judas son of Simon Iscariot to betray him. And during supper Jesus, knowing that the Father had given all things into his hands, and that he had come from God and was going to God, got up from the table, took off his outer robe, and tied a towel around himself. Then he poured water into a basin and began to wash the disciples' feet and to wipe them with the towel that was tied around him. He came to Simon Peter, who said to him, "Lord, are you going to wash my feet?" Jesus answered, "You do not know now what I am doing, but later you will understand." Peter said to him, "You will never wash my feet." Jesus answered, "Unless I wash you, you have no share with me." Simon Peter said to him, "Lord, not my feet only but also my hands and my head!" Jesus said to him, "One who has bathed does not need to wash, except for the feet, but is entirely clean. And you are clean, though not all of you." For he knew who was to betray him; for this reason he said, "Not all of you are clean." After he had washed their feet, had put on his robe, and had returned to the table, he said to them, "Do you know what I have done to you? You call me Teacher and Lord—and you are right, for that is what I am. So if I, your Lord and Teacher, have washed your feet, you also ought to wash one another's feet. For I have set you an example, that you also should do as I have done to you.

This is the Gospel of the Lord.

All: Praise to you, O Christ.

The Sermon or Homily is given

During The Washing of Feet we sing: Hymn 273 And now, of Father, mindful of the Love.

Lord Jesus Christ, you have taught us that what we do for the least of our brothers and sisters we do also for you: give us the will to be the servant of others as you were the servant of all, and gave up your life and died for us, but are alive and reign, now and for ever.

All: Amen.

Offertory Hymn: 294 Just as I am, without one plea.

Preparation of the Table

At the Eucharist we are with our crucified and risen Lord. We know that it was not only our ancestors, but we who were redeemed and brought forth from bondage to freedom, from mourning to feasting. We know that as he was with them in the upper room so our Lord is here with us now.

All: Until the kingdom of God comes let us celebrate this feast.

Blessed are you, Lord, God of the universe, you bring forth bread from the earth.

All: Blessed be God for ever.

Blessed are you, Lord, God of the universe, you create the fruit of the vine.

All: Blessed be God for ever.

The Eucharistic Prayer

The Lord be with you.

All: And with thy spirit.

Lift up your hearts.

All: We lift them up unto the Lord.

Let us give thanks to the Lord our God.

All: It is meet and right so to do.

It is indeed right to give you thanks, Father most holy, through Jesus Christ our Lord.

For on this night he girded himself with a towel and, taking the form of a servant, washed the feet of his disciples.

He gave us a new commandment that we should love one another as he has loved us.

Knowing that his hour had come, in his great love he gave this supper to his disciples to be a memorial of his passion, that we might proclaim his death until he comes again, and feast with him in his kingdom.

Therefore earth unites with heaven to sing a new song of praise; we too join with angels and archangels as they proclaim your glory without end:

**All: Holy, holy, holy, Lord God of hosts,
Heaven and earth are full of Thy glory.
Glory be to Thee, O Lord most high.
✠ Blessed is he that cometh in the name of the Lord:
Hosanna in the highest.**

Congregation Kneel or Sit.

Lord, you are holy indeed, the source of all holiness; grant that by the power of your Holy Spirit, and according to your holy will, these gifts of bread and wine may be to us the body and blood of our Lord Jesus Christ.

Who, in the same night that he was betrayed, took bread and gave you thanks; he broke it and gave it to his disciples, saying: Take, eat; this is my body which is given for you; do this in remembrance of me. ✠

In the same way, after supper he took the cup and gave you thanks; he gave it to them, saying: Drink this, all of you; this is my blood of the new covenant, which is shed for you and for many for the forgiveness of sins. Do this, as often as you drink it, in remembrance of me. ✠

Great is the mystery of faith:

All: Christ has died, Christ is risen, Christ will come again.

And so, Father, calling to mind his death on the cross, his perfect sacrifice made once for the sins of the whole world; rejoicing in his mighty resurrection and glorious ascension, and looking for his coming in glory, we celebrate this memorial of our redemption.

As we offer you this our sacrifice of praise and thanksgiving, we bring before you this bread and this cup and we thank you for counting us worthy to stand in your presence and serve you.

Send the Holy Spirit on your people and gather into one in your kingdom all who share this one bread and one cup, so that we, in the company of Mary, Virgin Mother of God, St. Thomas the Apostle and our Patron, and all the Saints, may praise and glorify you for ever, through Jesus Christ our Lord; by whom, and with whom, and in whom, in the unity of the Holy Spirit, all honour and glory be yours, almighty Father, for ever and ever.

All: ✠ Amen.

Invitation to Communion

✠ Jesus is the Lamb of God who takes away the sin of the world.
Blessed are those who are called to his supper.

All: Lord, I am not worthy to receive you,
but only say the word, and I shall be healed.

The Priest, Altar party, Choir and the congregation all receive communion.

If you are baptised and receive communion in your own church, you are welcome to receive communion here.

You are welcome to receive a blessing instead of communion. If you wish to receive a blessing, please keep your head bowed.

Prayers after Communion

Lord Jesus Christ, we thank you that in this wonderful sacrament you have given us the memorial of your passion: grant us so to reverence the sacred mysteries of your body and blood that we may know within ourselves and show forth in our lives the fruit of your redemption, for you are alive and reign, now and for ever.

All: Amen.

The Stripping of the Altar and Sanctuary

The Priest exchanges the Chasuble for the Cope and the Procession of the Blessed Sacrament begins.

The Procession of the Blessed Sacrament includes the Priest, Altar party and those who are observing 'The Watch', They move to the Altar of Repose in the Lady Chapel.

Those observing The 'first' Watch remain in the Lady Chapel.

Hymn 268 Of the glorious body telling. (vv. 1-4) (Pange Lingua) *is sung during the Procession.*

*We **Kneel** for the final two two verses).*

*When the Pange Lingua is complete, the People and Choir **Sit or Kneel.***

The Altar party strip the Altar and the Sanctuary.

*During the Stripping of the Altar and Sanctuary we Sing: **Hymn 515 Psalm 22.***

The Priest or a member of the Altar party concludes the service with the following words:

When the disciples had sung a hymn they went out to the Mount of Olives. Jesus prayed to the Father, 'If it is possible, take this cup of suffering from me.' He said to his disciples, 'How is it that you were not able to keep watch with me for one hour? The hour has come for the Son of Man to be handed over to the power of sinners.'

Christ was obedient unto death. Go in his peace.

***All please leave in silence,
or move quietly to the Altar of Repose for 'The Watch'***

The 'first' Watch finishes at Midnight with Compline.

'The Watch' resumes at 8am on Good Friday until 2pm as we walk 'The Way of the Cross' around the Stations

At 3pm the Solemn Liturgy of Good Friday begins.
